## ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

Review of the 129th Annual Meeting

Wednesday, April 11, 2018

President Tom Braley called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and determined a quorum to be present. A warm welcome was extended to everyone in attendance. Upon a motion from the floor, reading of the 2017 Annual Meeting Minutes was waived.

Results of the election for the Board of Managers to three year terms was announced:

Tom Braley (incumbent)

Terry Duperon (incumbent)

Michael Elliott (incumbent)

President Braley congratulated the winners and thanked the membership and staff and mentioned he was very honored to be president of a club of this caliber. He then turned over the meeting to Renee Johnston, club treasurer, who presented the following outstanding financial report:

- Cash position of \$75,000 in comparison to \$32,000 at the end of last year
- Accounts receivable totaling \$80,500 versus \$92,770 last year
- Endowment Fund totaling \$414,180 in comparison to \$372,855 at the end of last year
- Long term liabilities of \$50,000 in comparison to \$100,000 last year
- Food and beverage revenue up 10% over last year

Michael Elliott reported a net gain in membership of 10 over the past fiscal year. The membership count as of 2/28/18 is 296 versus 286 at the same time a year ago in spite of the death of several members as well as several member resignations.

Mr. Hardy mentioned that the general manager, Mark Frank, has a long list of things that need repair. The club will focus on taking care of some of those items.
